

## Contextual Background

### Higher Education Autonomy in Europe: supranational, national, and institutional trends (HEAE-SNIT)

The project *Higher Education Autonomy in Europe: Supranational, National and Institutional Trends* (HEAE-SNIT, 2023–2026), adopting a multi-level approach (European, national and institutional), compares HE systems in **France, Finland, Poland, Portugal, and the Netherlands**.

HEAE-SNIT examines how supranational dynamics are reshaping higher education (HE) autonomy in Europe and how these are translated at the national and institutional levels. It focuses on how governance trends affect HEIs' articulation of education, research and innovation in fulfilling their missions. In recent decades, HEIs have faced growing pressures that challenge their traditional purposes and autonomy, particularly through labour-market-oriented education and economically driven research agendas.

The project analyses how HEIs respond strategically to these pressures and the implications for educational programmes and academics' autonomy in research. While institutional impacts have been studied, the reconfiguration of HE autonomy, missions and purposes remains underexplored. By comparing diverse European contexts, the project challenges the assumption that global trends lead to uniform responses.
